



Regional Workforce Profile

The 37-town region served by Capital Workforce Partners has a land area of 973 square miles and is home to 959,322 residents.

The region's population is comprised of 75% whites, 11% Blacks, 11% Hispanics and 3% Other/Multi-Race individuals.







The region's median age is 39.7. The age distribution is demonstrated in the pie chart to the left.

Of residents age 25+, 18% do not have a high school diploma, 47% possess a diploma or some college, and 35% have earned an Associate's degree or higher.

The 2003 cumulative dropout rate was 7.8% (down 1.3% from previous year) and 84.1% of graduates pursue post-secondary education.



Thirty-five (35) percent of the region's population 16 and over function at literacy levels one and two (out of five levels, five being the highest). Individuals at levels one or two would not be able to perform the following tasks: read an ATM screen, decipher a bus schedule, read a newspaper, read the dosage on a medicine bottle, or fill out a job application.
