This survey shows that mid-sized grocery stores such as C-Town and Mega Foods can be very competitive and often less expensive than larger supermarkets like Stop \& Shop. But beware that sometimes the mid-sized stores may be more ex pensive, as we found at Bravo Supermarket and Model Market

Based on total cost for a basket of 29 basic foods, prices at Mega Foods at 76 New Britain Ave. were $13 \%$ lower than at Bravo Supermarket at 1291 Albany Avenue.

The best value for certain types of items (such as fruits and vegetables) may vary at stores. Also keep in mind that supermarkets such as Big Y and Stop \& Shop often offer large discounts on specific items. Keeping an eye out for sales is a big money saver.
