Thanks to several months of

hard work, tough decisions and prioritizing goals, Mayor Eddie Perez and City Council announced a budget for FY 2010-11 that will amount to a zero mill rate increase for Hartford taxpayers.

Included is a continued commitment to education with a modest increase to Hartford Public Schools of \$1.25 million. There will also be new classes for Police and Firefighters.

The total budget adjustment of \$9.8 million will be difficult to achieve, but the goal must be to challenge government and lessen the burden on taxpayers. To be clear, some property owners will see an increase in their tax bill because of State mandates including the phase in of revaluation and the phase out of the business surcharge.
