I. Executive Summary

On January 28¹, 2009 communities across Connecticut conducted their third statewide count of homeless individuals and families. CT Counts 2009 relied on non-profits, local and state government agencies, and hundreds of concerned volunteers from every region of the state to gather critical data about homeless adults and children in Connecticut. The data will be used to inform efforts to prevent and end homelessness and to help service providers and policy makers to better understand the needs of homeless people.

A census taken on an individual night provides a snapshot of a single point-in-time of homelessness; in addition to the information this initiative lends on homelessness within Connecticut, this point-in-time count gives local communities required data they must use to apply for federal funds. The count cannot serve as or supplant data compiled over time and is limited in its ability to contextualize homelessness throughout the state (See Section VI. Limitations and Caveats for further discussion).

The counts conducted in 2007 and 2008 began to establish baseline numbers and trend lines. CT Counts 2009, providing a third year of a single night's data, now paints a fuller picture of levels of homelessness, trends and characteristics of those who are homeless.

Adding the 2009 data to the '07 and '08 data leads to a conclusion: while homeless populations throughout the state experienced variations in geographic location and demographic characteristics this year, the data supporting CT Counts 2009 reveals that, homelessness remains static at a consistent level statewide.

Presented below are some salient findings from CT Counts 2009:

What's New?

Rural and suburban homelessness saw a dramatic increase from 2008 in Connecticut, especially for families and children in families, both up 33%. These findings are congruous with the latest national statistics².

What Has Not Changed?

The approximate number of total people counted as well as the total number of families counted in 2009 is identical to the totals counted for those populations in 2007. The overall statewide count of homeless single adults has seen very little change over the last three years.

What's Interesting?

Despite currently working, having income and education, and experiencing relatively few mental health and substance use factors contributing to their homelessness, a third of Connecticut families had to leave their place of residence due to rent problems.

Thirty-two percent (32%) of families were currently working at the time of the count. Seventy-eight percent (78%) of families reported having some source of income. Sixty percent (60%) of adults in families had a 12th grade education or higher³. Fiftyseven percent (57%) of adults in families reported no history of hospitalizations mental health or substance abuse. However, 43% of Connecticut families had to leave their last place of residence due to problems with rent or eviction⁴.

What Can Be Done?

1. Make affordable housing available through rental subsidies or housing development in communities throughout Connecticut.

2. Coordinate support services with housing. This includes employment training, access to quality child care, education, transportation, health care, and treatment. For some households this means permanent supportive housing and for others the services will be transitional.

Population Totals

An estimated 4,154 people were experiencing homelessness⁵ in Connecticut on the night of January 28⁶, 2009; these people were included in an approximate total of 3,320 households. Among those counted in sheltered settings, there were 2,482 single adults and 423 families with minor children. Counted in places unintended for human habitation such as streets, cars, parks, abandoned buildings, were 488 single adults and 7 families with minor children.

Eight-hundred and one (801) total children were counted along with their families. Seven hundred and ninety-three (793) children in families and 17 unaccompanied youth were counted in emergency shelter or transitional housing programs; 8 children in families and 1 unaccompanied youth were counted in locations unintended for human habitation.

Demographics

While the vast majority of sheltered single adults were male, it was far more likely to count a female as the adult in a family. Among sheltered single adults, males represented 70% (n=1,702) of those counted, with females representing 28% (n=670). The gender composition of sheltered adults in families was quite different however, with females comprising 90% (n=381) and males, 9% (n=38). This finding has maintained consistency throughout the three statewide CT Counts initiatives (Tables 1 and 2).

Single adults and adults in families differed greatly in their average age. Fifty-nine percent (59%) of single adults were over the age of 40 (n=1,707), while 65% of adults in families were between the ages of 22 and 39 (n=281), (Figure 1). These results are consistent from 2007 and 2008.

'White' was the most commonly reported racial/ethnic identity for all populations, with the exception of sheltered adults in families. Sheltered single adults, unsheltered single adults, and unsheltered adults in families most frequently reported their racial/ethnic identity as 'White', while 'Black or African American' was the most commonly reported racial/ethnic identity among sheltered adults in families, (38%, n=161). These results were also reflected in 2007 and 2008.

The most commonly attained last level of education attained by all survey respondents was 12^{th} grade; with 38% of sheltered single adults (n=908), 46% of sheltered adults in families (n=193), 32% of unsheltered single adults (n=156), and 33% of unsheltered adults in families (n=2) reporting 12^{th} grade. This finding is consistent from 2007 and 2008.

The data demonstrated some disparity between educational attainments for single adults versus adults in families (Figure 2). Forty-nine percent (49%, n=1,428) of single adults as opposed to 60% (n=256) of adults in families reported achieving a GED or high school education or higher.

Housing

'Rent problems' was the most commonly cited reason for leaving one's last place of residence across all populations; this finding was true in 2007 and 2008 as well⁷. 'Domestic violence' was the second most frequent response among sheltered adults in families (n=89, 21%). 'Conflict with family or friends' was also a popularly cited reason among sheltered adults in families, unsheltered single adults, and unsheltered adults in families for reason for leaving last place of residence. Eleven percent (11%, n=315) of single adults and 12% (n=50) of adults in families cited 'eviction' as the reason for leaving last residence⁸. Data on eviction was not collected in previous counts.

Rates of chronic homelessness varied only slightly from those found in 2007 and 2008 counts. Thirty-four percent (34%) of sheltered single adults and sheltered adults in families were found to be chronically homeless⁹ (single adults n=586, adults in families n=76). Fifty-five percent (55%) of both unsheltered single adults and unsheltered adults were found to be chronically homeless (single adults n=258, adults in families n=2).

The majority of sheltered adults in families reported having been without a permanent residence between 6 months and 2 years, (47%). This is compared to only 7% of the very same population who answered 1-2 months (Appendix A, Table A2). Table 3 demonstrates that on average, adults in families tended to report shorter lengths of time since leaving their last permanent residence than single adults; these findings from 2009 were found to be similar in 2008 (Table 4).

⁹ Under the HUD definition, a person who is "chronically homeless" is an unaccompanied homeless individual with a disabling condition who has either been continuously homeless for a year or more OR has had at least four (4) episodes of homelessness in the past three (3) years. In order to be considered chronically homeless, a person must have been sleeping in a place not meant for human habitation (e.g., living on the streets) and/or in an emergency homeless shelter.

Data illustrates that the location at which respondents were surveyed (in a sheltered or unsheltered location) was a strong indicator of where they had stayed the night before as well as in the last 30 days. Table 5 below demonstrates that single adults in shelter were far more likely to have spent the previous night in shelter while the vast majority of unsheltered single adults had slept the night before in a place not intended for human habitation. An overwhelming 75% (n=1802) of sheltered respondents reported sleeping in shelter within the last 30 days while 57% (n=281) of unsheltered respondents had slept in a place not meant for human habitation during the month prior to the count.

Unlike many of the other items for which data is collected during the count, when comparing the single adults versus adults in families (regardless of their sheltered or unsheltered situation at the time of the count), there is very little difference in where the two groups slept the night before the count (Table 6). The vast majority of single adults and adults in families reported spending the previous night in emergency shelter or transitional housing.

Economic Self-Sufficiency

Adults in families, both sheltered and unsheltered at the night of the count, were almost twice as likely to receive food stamps as sheltered and unsheltered single adults. Seventy percent (70%) of adults in families reported receiving food stamps versus 40% of single adults. Nineteen percent (19%) of single adults and 30% of adults in families reported income from work. Twenty-six percent (26%) of single adults and 37% of adults in families reported income from entitlements (Figure 4).

Besides Food Stamps, the most commonly reported sources of income were employment and Social Security among sheltered single adults, and TANF and employment among sheltered families. These findings were consistent in 2008.

A significant portion of all respondents were currently working at the time of the count. Thirty-two percent (32%) of adults in families and 18% percent of single adults responded that they were currently working. These results are similar to those found in 2008 (Figure 5 and 6); the percentage of adults in families currently working has experienced an increase since 2007 (Figure 6).

Health

Ninety-three percent (93%) of adults in families compared to 55% of single adults responded that they had health insurance who reported that they had health insurance. These results were almost identical to those found in 2008 and very similar to those from 2007 (Figure 7).

Histories of behavioral health issues were more common among single adults than adults in families, with 36% of single adults and 18% of adults in families reporting a history of mental health hospitalizations. Fifty-seven percent (57%) of single adults versus 17% of adults in families reported a history of using hospital, detox, or rehab services for a substance abuse problem. Thirty-six percent (36%) of single adults reported receiving substance abuse treatment at the time of the count while 13% of adults in families claimed to be receiving treatment. Thirty-seven percent (37%) of single adults and 18% of adults in families reported having a health condition that limited their ability to work, get around, or care for themselves. Six percent (6%) of all respondents had been told they had HIV or AIDS.


Special Populations

Eleven percent (11%) of all respondents reported having served in the military. Thirteen percent (13%) of single adults and 3% of adults in families reported serving in the military in 2009. These findings are similar to those reported in 2008 and 2008 (Figure 8).

Seventeen percent (17%, n=507) of single adults versus 5% (n=42) of adults in families were currently on probation, transitional supervision, or parole. In 2008, 14% (n=405) of single adults and 9% of adults in families were currently on probation, transitional supervision, or parole at the time of the count. Probation status was the most commonly reported type of correctional system involvement. This is consistent with 2008 findings. Items relating to correctional involvement were not included in the 2007 survey tool.




Age Breakdown - Single Adults Versus Adults in Families in 2009




Last Level of Education Achieved by Single Adults versus Adults in Families Counted in 2009






Food Stamp Receipt by Population in 2009




Income Sources for Single Adults Versus Adults in Families Counted in 2009











Currently Working - Single Adults Versus Adults in Families by Year




Rates of Health Insurance in Single Adults Versus Adults in Families by Year

II. Introduction

Since 2007, CT Counts has mobilized non-profits, local and state government agencies, and hundreds of concerned citizens from every region of the state to gather critical data in order to inform efforts to prevent and end homelessness. During these last three years, the Connecticut Coalition to End Homelessness along with the Reaching Home Campaign and the Corporation for Supportive Housing has partnered with the University of Pennsylvania Cartographic Modeling Lab and the Center for Urban Community Services Housing Resource Center (CUCS) for assistance in organizing a statewide count of homeless people. The Connecticut Coalition to End Homelessness provided statewide coordination of the 2009 count initiative as well as lead authorship on this CT Counts 2009 report; prior reports were authored chiefly by CUCS.

Connecticut's inaugural statewide homeless count using consistent data collection methods occurred on January 30, 2007. One year later, on January 30, 2008, communities across Connecticut conducted their second count of people living in emergency shelters, in transitional housing programs, in the woods, on the streets, and in cars or other unsheltered locations. Now in its third consecutive year, CT Counts 2009 is the first of these initiatives with the ability to begin to contextualize some of the findings in order to observe emerging patterns, make informed comparisons, and use this materializing knowledge to advise solutions and policies relating to homelessness.

Since 2003, the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) has required applicants for federal homeless assistance grants to report the number of people who are homeless in their communities at a particular time. HUD currently requires that communities conduct a point-in-time count during the last week of January. Collecting reliable baseline data is essential to understanding the causes of homelessness and designing effective interventions to help homeless people rebuild their lives. CT Counts continues to collect annual data in order to better understand the dynamic causes of homelessness, to evaluate the effectiveness of programs serving homeless people and, ultimately, to track progress towards ending homelessness in Connecticut.

It should be noted that select data presented in CT Counts 2008 was revised following report release. Data from 2008 presented here in this 2009 report reflects the updated and most accurate numbers from the 2008 CT Counts initiative to the knowledge of the authors.

CT Counts reports on data collected during a one-day point in time count conducted using consistent methodology across the state of Connecticut. Inclement weather affected the administration of the count in 2009 and some communities conducted counts 24 hours after the originally scheduled count timeframe. For the purposes of brevity, this report refers to January 28, 2009 as the timeframe for statewide conduct. Please see Section IV. Limitations and Caveats for further discussion.

Throughout this report, "single adult" refers to a person 18 years of age or older who is not accompanied by minor children, "unaccompanied youth" refers to a person under 18 years of age who is not accompanied by a parent or guardian, and "family" refers to a household of two or more people that includes minor children. This report uses the HUD definition of homelessness that was current at the time of the Count, which includes only people who fit one of the following descriptions at the time of the count: an unsheltered homeless person residing in a place not meant for human habitation, such as cars, parks, sidewalks, abandoned buildings, or on the street; a sheltered homeless person residing in an emergency shelter or transitional housing for homeless persons who originally came from the streets or emergency shelters.

VII. Conclusions and Implications


Since the first CT Counts initiative was conducted in 2007, overall findings remain notably static among both sheltered and unsheltered populations. The total number of homeless households, individuals and families remain within the margin of error when compared to the 2008 count. Demographic and other information generated from surveys do not contain any remarkable overall shifts in the general count of homeless households. As detailed in the 2007-2009 data comparisons section of this report (see Section V, 2007-2009 Data Comparisons), CT experienced a shift in the 2009 count which shows an overall decrease in the number of families using shelters (n=423, $\Delta n=50$, $\Delta\%=11$), an small downturn in the total number of single adults (n=2,902, $\Delta n=98$, $\Delta\%=3$) and slight decrease in the total number of homeless people in Connecticut overall (n=4,154, $\Delta n=67$, $\Delta\%=2$).

However, a closer look at suburban/rural vs. urban data suggests the potential shift toward a more geographically diverse population as well as reverse trends from the aggregate statewide data when focused only on urban communities. For the 2009 count. Balance of State communities experienced consistent increases across all populations, an overall increase of approximately one-third over 2008, while more urban communities across the state observed fairly uniform shrinkages in the single adult population and concomitant increases or holds in family and children in family populations (see Section V, 2007-2009 Data Comparisons). These results in CT mirror the most current national data offered within the 2008 Annual Homelessness Assessment Report, which finds substantial increases in suburban/rural homelessness among both singles and families from HMIS as well as point-in-time count data sources. The suburban/rural increases demonstrated in CT can be interpreted in such a way as to encourage continuation and expansion of approaches to ending homelessness that are regional in focus and direct affordable and supportive housing and other resource development efforts to suburban and rural communities.

That the population size and composition of Connecticut's homeless households has remained fairly consistent overall is significant both as an illustration of the usefulness as well as the limitations of the single day count approach in collecting homelessness data. The point-in-time method provides a means of capturing clear and descriptive information on the characteristics of Connecticut's homeless population - a description that has not only been consistent with national and regional data and research, but now, consistent over a three year period within Connecticut. But the single day count is also limited in its measurement of service usage among CT's shelter and transitional housing units, and a sampling of those sleeping out of doors. There remains no established methodology for counting scores of families doubled up in highly unstable living conditions and the federal definition of homelessness has not yet begun to support inclusion of these households in the point-in-time Count. Combined with this restriction, a hard limit on the number of shelter beds, geographical disparity in available beds, and factors

which may limit access to open beds on any single night provides a 'ceiling' in the total number of households that can be counted in a single day.


In Connecticut, it is estimated that more than 2,510 requests for shelter services were denied due to lack of available beds during January 2008¹⁹, with shelter related inquiries increasing by 22% during the first two guarters of 2009 as compared to the same time period in 2008, as reported by the states info-line/211 provider²⁰ (Figures 18 and 19). Shelter occupancy rates reported by the Department of Social Services based upon data generated by the shelters with whom they contract show that Connecticut's emergency shelters averaged a 101% utilization rate during the month of January 2009. A comparative analysis of data from 211 and DSS certainly support the notion that we are experiencing an increase in homelessness here in Connecticut, even though CT Counts is less convincing.

As for the dynamics of the overall population, it is clear that the continued development of permanent supportive housing is indicated as rates of mental illness and other disabling conditions continue to be significant among long term and street homeless. Fifty-seven percent (57%, n=1,658) of single adults reported having been in hospital, detox, or rehab for substance abuse, 36% (n=1,036) had been hospitalized for mental health, and 32% (n=917) reported needing help for substance abuse at the time of the count. As with the previous two reports, such barriers among families - while present for some - are much lower. Comparatively, only 17% (n=74) of adults in families had been in hospital, detox, or rehab for substance abuse, 18% (n=76) had been hospitalized for mental health, and 2% needed help with a substance issue at the time of the count. The remarkable disparity between service needs of single adults as opposed to adults in families strongly suggests a need for affordable housing, increased income, and access to services such as childcare, and transportation as key factors to reducing homelessness among families.

Rates of chronic homelessness have experienced little fluctuation over the last three count initiatives. Thirty-six percent (36%) of sheltered single adults were determined to be chronically homeless in 2007, 32% were determined so in 2008 and 34% in 2009. Among unsheltered single adults, 52% were counted as chronically homeless in 2007, 51% in 2008, and 55% in 2009. Further the number of chronically homeless disabled single adults counted in 2009 was almost identical to the number counted in 2008 (n=844, $\Delta n=9$, $\Delta=1\%$). These stationary and persisting results suggest that the current capacity of Connecticut's supportive housing system is insufficient and additional units to the existing approximate 4,400 units are necessary to address the current need and reduce the number of long term homeless. Although new persons will accrue into eligibility as long-term homeless, creation of a sufficient supply of supportive housing should eventually establish enough housing vacancies through unit turnover to accommodate new cases. As Connecticut continues to develop new and additional capacity, the data contained in this report and additional analysis of the population and capacity data gathered through CT Counts 2007 and 2008 can help to inform statewide development plans (e.g. the Reaching Home Campaign Plan) and could also prove useful to planning efforts in local communities.

While supportive housing is recommended for the disabled chronic homeless population, another segment of those experiencing homelessness in Connecticut would be best suited quite simply through availability of and accessibility to affordable housing. Adults in families reported markedly lower rates of behavioral health problems and disabilities than single adults. Thirty percent (30%) of all adults in families reported that they were receiving income at the time of the count from employment²¹. Similarly, 32% of adults in families said that they were currently working, and 78% of adults in families reported having some source of income²². In addition to these results, 2009 data shows that the majority of families (60%) are not homeless for longer than one year nor for as long as is reported by the single adults. Despite these figures, 32% of adults in families responded that they had left their last place of residence due to rent problems. These results relating to disability, income and employment, length of homelessness, and rent problems are in line with those from the 2007 and 2008 count.

Acknowledged in conjunction, it is clear from these figures that many families could secure and sustain housing with varying levels and types of income support as well as improved housing and employment options. This year, recommendations for many families echo those provided in past reports; readily available affordable housing accompanied by increased employment opportunities, rental subsidies, and income supports such as relocation grants, transitional (time-limited) rental assistance, and more long-term subsidies. The availability of short and medium term rental assistance through federal stimulus funding (Homelessness Prevention and Rapid Re-Housing Program) in the early fall will provide a temporary resource to meet this need. Specifically, such one time and temporary assistance seems to be most appropriate for the family population which we have described in this report and may even affect the number of families residing in shelters in time for the 2010 count.

The findings of the 2009 CT Counts are consistent once again with national data both as it relates to the characteristics of homeless household and the seeming lack of significant increases or decreases in overall population size. As concluded in 2008, most are single adults, half of whom have a behavioral health disability and half of whom have been homeless for longer than one year. The singles are also mostly male, and aging. Families are younger, have much lower levels of disability, and are homeless for shorter periods. In both cases, they represent the profiles of the people who are among the neediest in the state – young children and disabled adults. National experts are expecting increases as the result of the current recession to become more apparent over the three year period beginning with 2009²³, predicting a lag effect of the mortgage crisis and rising unemployment. The National Alliance to End Homelessness recently reported,

Recessions hit poor households significantly harder than others. Those households that are already at risk of homelessness are put at even greater risk due to the unavoidable consequences of economic decline.... Sudden and/or sustained unemployment leaves [these households] unable to afford rent, and those who lack adequate support systems lose their housing.... Besides its effect on earnings for families... recessions also make it harder for familial and social support systems to step up and help a family in danger of becoming homeless.²³

During this immediately critical juncture as this lag effect wares, the preventative measures in combination with the rental assistance and supportive housing mentioned above are necessary to handle those currently experiencing homelessness as well as the potential influx in homelessness throughout the state of Connecticut.

VIII. Considerations for the Future

Utilizing three years of experience and knowledge, feedback from local and regional coordinators, volunteers, shelter staff, and state and local agencies is compiled and presented below.

Utilize a mixed methodological approach to the conduct of the unsheltered count.

Addressing the repeated and pervasive concerns surrounding unsheltered methodology is of great import (for further discussion (see Section VI, Limitations and Caveats). Engaging in more in-depth conversation with individuals and communities who are interested in employing a better-suited methodology in rural areas is critical to understanding how the unsheltered count may work most effectively in those areas. Independent research into existing publications, studies, and count reports from other states, as well as consultation with specializing researchers, can help statewide coordinators determine the best possible avenues for unsheltered methodological approaches in future counts. To foster the most accurate statewide count of street homelessness, the option of conducting the unsheltered count in more than one way across the state should be thoroughly explored.

Test other unsheltered methodologies or skip unsheltered count during non-HUD mandated Point in Time Count years.

Take the opportunity lent by non-HUD mandated Point-in-Time Count years to explore other optional methodologies that may be utilized in the unsheltered count. The significant concerns regarding appropriateness of the traditional unsheltered methodology that is vocalized by various regions of the state can be addressed during these off-years without affecting the consistency and comparability of count reports in mandated years. Testing the viability of a service-based rather than street count methodology in concerned areas is one option; conducting the count during warmer seasons is another. Communities in which the traditional methodology functions effectively may skip the unsheltered count during these non-mandated years to preserve financial and human resources.

Conduct sheltered count through Homelessness Management Information System (HMIS).

Eliminate the need for galvanized staff and volunteers, paper forms, and lengthy data collection by taking advantage of systems already in place such as HMIS. In communities where data quality is at 90% or higher, conducting the sheltered count through HMIS reporting is recommended. It will be necessary to update the HMIS intake screen with additional items included on the sheltered client survey and train shelter staff to enter those accordingly beforehand.

Design methods to ensure more committed engagement from local coordinators.

Streamlining the coordination process and laying out the role of local coordinators is suggested. Retaining experienced coordinators, providing structured and digestible organization materials, and increasing community stipends can help establish more unified and invested local coordination. Improving train-the-trainer and regional trainings is also recommended; this can be accomplished by revising presentation materials, re-organizing the structure of trainings so as to train smaller groups in more diverse areas of the state, and recruiting excellent former local coordinators to assist in the trainings.

Schedule the count as early as possible within the HUD-mandated timeframe.

Conduct of the count should be scheduled on the first day of the HUD-mandated timeframe, the last week of January, and the snow date should be scheduled as late as possible within the mandated timeframe. In the event of inclement weather, this kind of strategic scheduling will allow for more time to discuss options across the state in moving forward, reorganize volunteers, and for hazardous conditions to be addressed.

Align advocacy efforts to communicate local and statewide concerns to HUD.

Help communities organize advocacy efforts to communicate concerns surrounding the count at a federal level. The facilitation of discussions, message development, and effective communication to HUD relating to the mandated timing, stipulations, and limitations of the count is recommended.




CT Counts 2009 – CT Statewide Results

On the night of January 28, 2009 Statewide:

There were approximately **4,154 people** experiencing homelessness¹ This number includes:

- 3320 households
- 2902 single adults
- 430 families
- 801 children in families



* Eviction includes 'evicted for a reason other than rent problems or foreclosure', 'evicted due to landlord's foreclosure', & 'foreclosure of own home'. **Sheltered and Unsheltered populations are aggregated here.

13% of single adults served in the military.

18% of single adults and 32% of adults in families were currently working.

58% of single adults and 18% of adults in families had been in a hospital, detox or rehab for substance use.

50% of single adults and 60% of adults in families had a 12th grade education or higher².

38% of single adults and 18% of adults in families reported suffering from a health condition that limits their ability to work, get around, and care for themselves.

34 % of sheltered single adults and sheltered adults in families and, 55% of unsheltered single adults and unsheltered adults in families found on the night of the count were Chronically Homeless³.



There were approximately **735 people** experiencing homelessness¹ This number includes:

- 568 single adults

30% of sheltered single adults and sheltered adults in families and, 58% of unsheltered single adults and unsheltered adults in families found on the night of the count were Chronically Homeless³.



On the night of January 28, 2009 in Bridgeport-Stratford-Fairfield:

There were approximately **300 people** experiencing homelessness¹ This number includes:

- 225 households
- 186 single adults
- 40 families
- 74 children in families

19% of single adults served in the military.

19% of single adults and 38% of adults in families were currently working.

74% of single adults and 13% of adults in families had been in a hospital, detox or rehab for substance use.

45% of single adults and 76% of adults in families had a 12th grade education or higher².

50% of single adults reported suffering from a health condition that limits their ability to work, get around, and care for themselves.

36% of sheltered single adults and sheltered adults in families and, 56% of unsheltered single adults and unsheltered adults in families found on the night of the count were chronically homeless³.



14% of single adults served in the military.

18% of single adults and 25% of adults in families were currently working.

58% of single adults and 46% of adults in families had been in a hospital, detox or rehab for substance use.

60% of single adults and 67% of adults in families had a 12th grade education or higher².

34% of single adults and 9% of adults in families reported suffering from a health condition that limits their ability to work, get around, and care for themselves.

14% of sheltered single adults and sheltered adults in families and, 57% of unsheltered single adults and unsheltered adults in families found on the night of the count were Chronically Homeless³.








CT Counts 2009 – Middlesex County Results

On the night of January 28, 2009 in Middlesex County:

There were approximately **215 people** experiencing homelessness¹ This number includes:

- 169 households
- 144 single adults
- 25 families
- 46 children in families

52% of single adults and 8% of adults in families reported suffering from a health condition that limits their ability to work, get around, and care for themselves.

8% of sheltered single adults and sheltered adults in families and, 67% of unsheltered single adults and unsheltered adults in families found on the night of the count were Chronically Homeless³.



CT Counts 2009 – New Britain Results On the night of January 28, 2009 in New Britain:

There were approximately **122 people** experiencing homelessness¹ This number includes:

- 109 households
- 101 single adults
- 8 families
- 13 children in families

13% of single adults served in the military.

13% of single adults and 50% of adults in families were currently working.

44% of single adults had been in a hospital, detox or rehab for substance use.

52% of sheltered single adults and sheltered adults in families had a 12th grade education or higher².

48% of single adults reported suffering from a health condition that limits their ability to work, get around, and care for themselves.

35% of sheltered single adults and sheltered adults in families and, 67% of unsheltered single adults and unsheltered adults in families found on the night of the count were Chronically Homeless³.



CT Counts 2009 – New Haven Results On the night of January 28, 2009 in New Haven:

There were approximately **677 people** experiencing homelessness¹ This number includes:

- 521 households
- 457 single adults
- 65 families
- 130 children in families

7% of single adults served in the military.

14% of single adults and 36% of adults in families were currently working.

10% of single adults had been told they had HIV or AIDS.

44% of single adults and 65% of adults in families had a 12th grade education or higher².

46% of single adults reported suffering from a health condition that limits their ability to work, get around, and care for themselves.

38% of sheltered single adults and sheltered adults in families and, 50% of unsheltered single adults and unsheltered adults in families found on the night of the count were Chronically Homeless³.







CT Counts 2009 – Stamford-Greenwich Results On the night of January 28, 2009 in Stamford-Greenwich:

There were approximately **282 people** experiencing homelessness¹ This number includes:

- 219 households
- 175 single adults
- 43 families
- 62 children in families

11% of single adults served in the military.

15% of single adults and 17% of adults in families were currently working.

44% of single adults had been in a hospital, detox or rehab for substance use.

48% of single adults and 59% of adults in families had a 12th grade education or higher².

33% of single adults and 24% of adults in families reported suffering from a health condition that limits their ability to work, get around, and care for themselves.

37% of sheltered single adults and sheltered adults in families and, 30% of unsheltered single adults and unsheltered adults in families found on the night of the count were Chronically Homeless³.




CT Counts 2009 – Waterbury Results

On the night of January 28, 2009 in Waterbury:

There were approximately **171 people** experiencing homelessness¹ This number includes:

- 133 households
- 117 single adults
- 16 families
- 38 children in families



**Sheltered and Unsheltered populations are aggregated here.

6% of single adults and 19% of adults in families were currently working.

19% of single adults had been hospitalized for mental health.

64% of sheltered single adults and sheltered adults in families had a 12th grade education or higher².

57% of adults in families reported suffering from a health condition that limits their ability to work, get around, and care for themselves.

45% of single adults had been in a hospital, detox or rehab for substance use.

18% of sheltered single adults and sheltered adults in families and, 30% of unsheltered single adults and unsheltered adults in families found on the night of the count were Chronically Homeless³.

¹ Total people count is derived from the sum of sheltered single adults, sheltered adults in families, unsheltered single adults, unsheltered adults in families, unaccompanied youth, and children in families counted during CT Counts 2009 in the specified region.
