Information Searching

Literature, data and images may be located on a broad range of topics, including:

- Community Data
Population, housing, economic, education, health, vital statistics, crime statistics as available by country, state, region, city, neighborhood, and census tract
- Business Research
Company and industry profiles, financials, rankings
- Historical Research
Local to international history, genealogy, newspaper articles, fact checking, biographies
- Governmental Research
Federal, state and city bills, statutes and regulations; city ordinances
- Image Searches
Photographs, graphics, maps

Extracting and Arranging Information

The sources may be mined and the information arranged to:

- Compare data sets
- Categorize by type
- Sequence by chronological, numeric or alphabetic order

Presentation

Your final product may be delivered in electronic, paper or display format, including:

- Static maps of single or multiple data sets
- Color graphs and charts
- Spreadsheets with formulas
- Powerpoint slides
- Databases
- Reports and executive summaries
- Static and interactive webpages
- Photocopies and image scans

Rates

Hartford Public Library provides research services that require less than 20 minutes at no charge.

Research services requiring longer than 20 minutes are quoted on a per project basis, depending on the level of difficulty and the number of hours needed, at a cost recovery rate (\$40-85 per hr.)
