A Visual Guide To Sheff vs. O'Neill Progress

Ten years after the landmark Sheff vs. O'Neill desegregation case ruling, the racial make-up of Hartford's schools is little changed.


Some of the region's 22 magnet schools have achieved integration beyond the levels of their surrounding student populations. But others have minority enrollments too high to qualify as "integrated" under the terms of the court-set goal.

Magnet schools have increased educational opportunities for Hartford's minority students. But nearly 40 percent of minorities in magnet schools in 2005-06 lived in suburbs. Suburban minority students are enrolling at magnet schools in higher proportions than suburban whites.

Most Hartford students in magnet schools in 2005-06 cannot be counted under the Sheff criteria because the proportion of minority students at their schools exceeded the standard defined in the settlement, according to an analysis by Trinity College and University of Connecticut researchers.

Five magnet schools currently shown as meeting the integration standard only qualified under a start-up grace period ending when the school enters its third year of operation.

Measuring Magnet Schools Against The Integration Standard

The numbers beside the magnet schools listed below correspond with those on the map at left. Nine of the schools meet or exceed the integration standard outlined by the Sheff settlement, but six others do not. Five are in danger of not qualifying when their three-year grace periods expire. Hartford minority students attending "integrated" schools are counted toward the Sheff desegregation goal.
