



## Town of Wethersfield Workforce Profile

Wethersfield is located 4 miles south of Hartford, has a land area of approximately 12 square miles and is home to 26,726 residents.

Wethersfield's population is comprised of 89% whites, 2% Blacks, 4% Hispanics, and 5% Other/Multi-Race individuals.







The town's median age is 45. The age distribution is demonstrated in the pie chart to the left.

Of Wethersfield residents age 25+, 17% do not have a high school diploma, 45% possess a diploma or some college, and 38% have earned an Associate's degree or higher (State: 16%, 46%, and 38% respectively).

The 2003 cumulative dropout rate was 4.1% (down 3.3% from the previous year) and 86.6% of graduates pursue post-secondary education (down 1.4%).





Forty (40) percent of Wethersfield's population 16 and over functions at literacy levels one and two (out of five levels, level five being the highest). Individuals at levels one or two would <u>not</u> be able to read an ATM screen, decipher a bus schedule, read a newspaper, read the dosage on a medicine bottle, or fill out a job application.
